About Northern Society of Chartered Accountants

Northern Society of Chartered Accountants (NorSCA) was founded on 31 July 1882 with its inaugural meeting in Newcastle upon Tyne. The Society was established to support and encourage chartered accountants in the north of England to act in the public interest and to enhance their professional knowledge.

The Society was founded only two years after the formation of ICAEW (the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales) which was formed 11 May 1880 when the founding societies of Liverpool, Manchester, London and Sheffield agreed to form a national organisation.

Today Northern Society is a membership body for circa 4,000 ICAEW Chartered Accountants and ACA students who work across business & the finance profession in the North East, Teesside, North Yorkshire and Cumbria.

We have been at the heart of northern business for over 135 years.







As well as promoting northern business we support our members through a programme of locally delivered training, networking and social events. In the last year these comprised 13 CPD training sessions and in excess of 20 networking events. The 13 technical courses covered a spectrum of topics to appeal to members working in practice, industry, the public sector and in not-for-profit organisations. The networking events included a popular mix of soft skills and social events. Details of upcoming events can be found at norsca.co.uk/events

Our three branch societies running local events are **Cumberland Society of Chartered Accountants** (from the Scottish border down to Millom and Kirkby Stephen including all CA postcodes), **Teesside Society of Chartered Accountants** (the DL postcodes in south Durham, Cleveland and North Yorkshire as far south as Northallerton, Thirsk/Bedale and west to include Richmond, Leyburn & Hawes) and **Tyne & Wear Society of Chartered Accountants** (the DH postcodes of Durham plus all postcodes of Wearside, Tyneside, Tyne Valley and Northumberland up to the Scottish border).

Our three younger member groups are **NEYCAG** (the North East Young Chartered Accountants' Group), **NCASS** (the Northern Chartered Accountant Students' Society) and **CCASS** (the Cumberland Chartered Accountant Students' Society).

FINANCES

The Northern Society's principal financial objective is to break even, on average, from year to year. We continue to have strong support from members who volunteer their time to plan and arrange our programme of courses and events which are of interest to other members.

As the world knows, 2020 was a very challenging year, however the Northern Society finances came through very well, producing a surplus of £8,765. After the first events of the year – the pan-professional supper in Teesside, and the Redworth weekend conference for practitioners, such events as could be held were all on-line. Whilst more challenging for presenters and the technical people keeping everything working, CPD courses are more cost-effective delivered virtually, hence the decision to provide 30% discount throughout the pandemic restrictions. This discount continued into 2021.

Networking events, from sector specific events through the economic forum which embrace the Business Confidence Monitor, were delivered to growing audiences of members without the costs of a physical event. So whilst we are all no doubt in need of eye tests from spending huge amounts of each working day concentrating on computer screens, there is an upside for those holding the purse strings. The change to ways things are done are with us all to stay, however we do look forward to being able to resume face to face networking events and as much of our CPD programme as is possible.

We reduced the frequency, but continued to print and send our news reports alongside details of upcoming events and courses, now half yearly. Also as a result of fewer members choosing to receive these local updates, the cost has fallen. If you are one of the growing number of members not receiving the mailing, it is because, on ICAEW's member profile page, you have not opted in (checked the preference box) for "Regional updates". There is a brief instruction article on norsca.co.uk on how to ensure you will receive your local mailings and occasional emails on local events and courses.

The two key events couldn't take place in 2020, so whilst it was a huge disappointment that the prizegiving for successful students in the ICAEW's 2019 exams – heading for a record attendance in excess of 180 students and guests – had to be cancelled and the Annual Dinner was rescheduled for a later year, there was again the financial upside of the significant costs of these events not being incurred.

For many years the key issue for the Society's ongoing financial health stems from the commercial success of our CPD programme. ICAEW CPD provision in shorter sessions with no notes and no interaction with the presenters could be seen as competition to our NorSCA courses. We don't see that as the case, but that NorSCA topics complement the ICAEW offering with a tailored, sometimes specialist, programme of 3 hour courses, where we do issue speaker notes and, due to the smaller audience sizes, there is the opportunity to ask questions.

We did receive commission from Mercia for their "Northern Society" programme of courses, and also from ICAEW on attendances by NorSCA members at ICAEW "Essentials" courses in 2020, however quite how much will be the case in future from either of these providers is currently uncertain.

In the second half of 2020, as we still awaited new tax legislation and Brexit changes remained enveloped in fog, it felt that this lack of change compounded by screen overload were contributing factors to a number of the on-line courses attracting declining numbers which resulted a financial loss. As was the case this time last year, we must improve this going forward through careful management of the courses programme, ensuring we continue to provide value to our members, whilst delivering surplus cash to contribute to our whole programme of events in support of our members.

The Honorary Treasurers Keith Proudfoot and Therese McCollam would like to note their thanks for the support received from Joanne Lucking, the previous Treasurer Stuart Stone for a smooth and generous handover period, the ICAEW District Accounts Team, and Colin Hutson Accounting in helping them to carry out their duties.

COMMUNICATING WITH MEMBERS

Northern Society aims to communicate with its members on a regular basis across the year in order to make members aware of new developments; inform them of upcoming courses and events which may be of interest and to obtain members views on topical issues. This allows the Society to reflect the views of chartered accountants across the North East and Cumbria, both locally and at national level with ICAEW.

The production and distribution of the magazine and of the courses and events booklet represents one of the Society's largest financial outgoings. We have continued to invest in hard copy communications over the past year but, commensurate with the overall financial position of the Society as shown in the accounts, we have considered the different communication channels available to us rather than just relying on the hard copy magazine being made available in printed form.

Following careful consideration Northern Society launched its own website norsca.co.uk in March 2014 to provide a channel for members to find out quickly and easily details of courses and events as well as a way to disseminate news more quickly. The Northern Society website also brings together the former NEYCAG and NCASS websites onto a single integrated

platform which further demonstrates the strong links with our younger member groups. The website was designed to be easy to navigate and with 'responsive design' content is formatted for optimal viewing whether using a desktop PC, tablet, iPad, iPhone or Android device. Each CPD course and event on norsca.co.uk is accompanied by a 'click-through' button to book online at icaew.com.

The Society has continued to publish a regular magazine ("NorSCA News") which has been published twice during the year and distributed by post to all members who have indicated in their ICAEW member preferences that they wish to receive local communications. The magazine continues to keep members in touch with local news and events, with a focus on member activities. With thanks to Keith Proudfoot for his editing and management of this process. If you do not regularly receive this in hard copy please ensure that you have selected to receive 'Regional updates – news, course and networking in your area' in your member preferences at icaew.com/preferences

The Society has also continued to make use of social media communication channels including Twitter (@ICAEW_NorSCA) and LinkedIn Groups to communicate with members. Members who have a profile on LinkedIn can join the Northern Society LinkedIn Group as well as sub-groups for Tyne & Wear, Teesside, Cumberland, NEYCAG and NCASS.

COURSES AND CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The Northern Society and its branches continue to provide a varied and extensive courses programme to assist members in fulfilling their CPD requirements. During 2020 due to the pandemic the course offering to members has been converted to a smaller online offering. The Society was able to hold its successful Residential Course at Redworth Hall (our General Practitioner weekend conference) before restrictions on events came into play. During the year the society held 13 events attended by 404 participants.

We remain one of the most active providers of local CPD courses for accountants in our area. Through proactive forward planning we remain successful in attracting high quality speakers to present topics to members in the North East and Cumbria. These have included regular updates on tax, accounting and audit issues. We are always pleased to receive suggestions of topics for future courses from members.

ANNUAL DINNER

The Annual Dinner due to take place on Friday 18 October 2020 at Newcastle Civic Centre was postponed to 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

MEMBER SUPPORT

Our member support contacts provide practical support and assistance, in an entirely confidential way, to members with problems. Diane Cartwright, Doug Kinsey and Bill Graham currently act as Support Members.

CHARTERED ACCOUNTANTS BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION (CABA)

Keith Proudfoot and Les Hodgson are the Liaison Officers between the Northern Society and CABA whose purpose is to assist current and former ICAEW Chartered Accountants and their families in both practical and financial ways where necessary.

RECRUITMENT, EDUCATION & TRAINING

The annual prize giving ceremony in May, which recognises the achievements of local and national prize-winners from the Northern Society area and all those who have passed their ICAEW Advanced Level exams during the preceding year has become an established part of our calendar. COVID-19 forced two postponements of this event during 2020 resulting in a further revision of dates into 2021.

Careers fairs continue to be held at local universities, albeit virtually at the moment.
